





## **SQA Higher Russian External Assessment Report 2014**

### **General comments**

- There was a slight increase in the number of candidates presented this year (52) from 2013 (36).
- Candidates generally displayed a competent performance this year.
- The vast majority of candidates were able to gain an award A-C.

## Reading and Directed Writing

- With the exception of Qs 1(b) and 2(a), candidates performed well in reading comprehension.
- Some candidates did not provide sufficient detail in their answers to access the marks in in Qs 1(b) and 2(a).
- Some candidates had difficulty rendering their answers in competent English.
- Handwriting proved difficult to discern in some cases.
- Generally, many candidates lost marks in the DW due to their failure to address all Bullet Points, or to address them fully enough to gain the available marks.

### Listening and personal response essay

- Some reasonably straightforward vocabulary caused candidates some problems.
- In the Essay, some candidates were unable to form verbs successfully, and some were prone to inappropriate phonetic spelling.

# Advice to centres on the preparation of future candidates

#### General

- Centres must ensure that all candidates know fully what the requirements of the papers will demand of them.
- Candidates should be reminded that answers should be legible at all times and in all papers.

#### **Directed Writing**

- All Bullet Points must be **fully** prepared for.
- Centres should ensure that candidates have enough opportunity to apply dictionary skills in preparation for the exam as these can be weak at times.
