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## **Opening of the Confucius Hub at Culross Primary School**

our cluster primary schools and we look forward to working collaboratively with the Culross Hub to deliver an engaging Chinese language and cultural curriculum.



S3 pupils Bethany McIntosh, Katherine Smith and Abbie Carrie gave an eloquent presentation, delivered in Mandarin, about their experiences of learning the language. After musical performances from Culross pupils,

three of our senior pupils (Fiona McArthur, Erin Moyes and Matthew Godsell) demonstrated their skills on the Chinese drums to rapturous applause from the audience!







Kirsty Baxter, ex-QAHS pupil who is studying Mandarin at university in Tianjin, shared her experiences of learning and living in China and encouraged all pupils to stick with learning Mandarin at Queen Anne. ## China Immersion Programme: 8-23 July 2018

As a Confucius Hub, we have been given a fantastic opportunity for one teacher and ten pupils to participate in the Summer Culture and Language Immersion Programme in China (8-23 July 2018).

The programme is organised jointly by the Confucius Institute for Scotland's Schools and Hanban. Pupils from schools across Scotland will enjoy a 2 week trip to Beijing and Tianjin. The programme

includes Mandarin and cultural lessons at the Tianjin Foreign Studies University and sightseeing in both Beijing and Tianjin.

The trip is heavily subsidised by the Confucius Institute and Hanban (and at zero cost to QAHS) and participants are asked to pay £600 towards costs. All flights, accommodation, visas, food/drinks, entry fees to visitor attractions and all other in-country costs are included in the cost of the trip. Spending money is not included. Pupils will receive SQA accreditation on successful completion of the language course. Pupils must complete 10 hours of Mandarin study in Scotland before going to China and the school will support pupils with this. #### **Essential Criteria for Pupils**

The following criteria has been set by the Confucius Institute and Hanban and applicants must meet these requirements:

- You must have an interest in studying Mandarin or already be studying Mandarin and be able to continue your language learning on your return.\*
- You should understand that the purpose of this programme is to learn about Chinese language and culture and much of your time will be spent in class engaging in learning activities.
- You must be willing to be flexible and understand that many customs and experiences will be different from the UK, including the food.
- You will need to be open to experiencing other cultures as you will be taking part in a short home visit to a carefully selected family, unaccompanied by your teacher.
- You should be able to cope with a physically demanding programme.
- You should currently be in S4 or S5.
- You must be no younger than 15 at the time of the trip.
- You should be in possession of a passport which is valid for 6 months after the date of travel and has 2 free passport pages\*\*

\*\* If you do not currently have a valid passport then this should not stop you from applying for a place. Under certain circumstances, we can assist with securing a passport.

#### **Pupil Applications**

Pupils who wish to be considered for this programme must submit a competitive application as below:

In no more than 300 words, outline how your participation in the programme will contribute towards your personal development and the school's three key concepts of personal best, human aspect and self-worth. Applications must be delivered to Mr Sinclair by 3.40pm on Friday 9 February 2018.

All applications will be considered by a panel of QAHS staff and shortlisted candidates will be asked to attend an interview for final selection. Interviews will take place after the mid-term February break.

Pupils should speak with Miss Lindsay (Modern Languages) or Mr Sinclair (Depute Rector) if they have any questions. Parents/carers should contact Mr Sinclair in the first instance.

<sup>\*</sup>The course is aimed at beginner level Mandarin learners. If your level is higher than this, please be aware that classes cannot be catered to your level.
