Objectives: The objectives of the SCEN China Youth Summit at Gleneagles are to bring together young people to experience Gleneagles in its international context (the G8 Summit was held here in 2005) and to promote the importance of learning about China and learning Chinese, and linking Scottish and Chinese education, culture and business.
